

Dear Parishioners: Christ is born! Glorify Him! Христос Рождається! Славіте Його!

Can you believe it!? We have already arrived at the Sunday of Zacchaeus. That means that the Great Fast is not far away (less than a month, in fact)! Today also happens to be the Feast of the Three Holy Hierarchs - Sts. John Chrysostom, Basil the Great and Gregory the Theologian. This Wednesday is the major feast of Стрітення! i.e. The Encounter a.k.a. The Presentation of our Lord! Let's enjoy these feasts by rightful prayer and celebration! Rest, meet family and friends (including fellow parishioners) online, enjoy a meal or treat, make a virtual pilgrimage - again, online, to put on your coat and walk around the block praying a rosary, go for a drive to/past our church or other churches, stopping to say a prayer, etc. The important thing to know is that Jesus wants to be at your home today and forever. He looks up to you wherever you are at, wherever you may be hiding... (yeah, He knows where you're at)... and He really wants you to "come on down" from that tree, because He has plans for you that will probably knock

- 1. Our deepest sympathy and condolences are extended to the family and friends of +Stella **Iwanciw** who entered recently into her eternal rest. Please keep her family in your prayers. May God grant her Eternal Rest! Вічная Пам'ять!
- Please continue to pray for Ukraine and for world peace. We had an amazing day last week (Wednesday) when different Ukrainian Catholic parishes throughout the province took an hour and livestreamed or posted a service online — Divine Liturgies, or Molebens, or the Rosary, or a Parastas, or carolled.... what a delightful variant of prayer that ascended as incense to Our Lord. May we continue to pray together, and draw ever closer to Our Lord in common supplication and adoration.
- 3. These are the last days of singing Christmas carols! Enjoy, because the Christmas season will end on Tuesday. Come pray one last time this year at our manger scene, it will be dismantled tomorrow.
- 4. Vespers this Tuesday at 5:30 PM join us in church or online for Vespers (60 min.) in preparation for the feast day the next day. (with blessing of bread, oil, wine & wheat)(safe myrovannya)
- 5. Wednesday is a holy-day, the **Presentation of the Infant Jesus in the Temple**. It is also the world-wide Day of Consecrated Life (ie. vocations). Please come to church either for the morning Divine Liturgy at 8 AM or the evening one at 6 PM. Candles will be blessed for you to take home afterwards. And pray for your priests and sisters. AND think about it for yourself and be open to encourage your children and grandchildren to consider life as a priest, sister, deacon... Our holy Church needs so many more men and women to step up and give their lives to God. Maybe your son? daughter? grandson?
- 6. The popular Zoom discussions —"I BELIEVE! BIPYO!" that Fr. Michael Kwiatkowski leads every Wednesday night at 7 PM continue! These sessions have begun as focused discussions on articles of our Creed. So yes, there will be a starting lesson, but then we discuss the theme or other topics of your interest. It is an excellent way to brush up on our Faith, and to fill in the gaps we may have in our understanding of our relationship with our Lord and His Church. Stand/kneel in the back of the church... or come up to the front...pray with the leaders, or just pray quietly in the way that works best for you. The Lord sees all! But He blesses richly those who pray with others, for a common purpose. Our purpose that night: reparation to the Lord for the sins of the world, and supplication for peace in the world.

- 13. Realize that your differences are blessings. You and your spouse very likely remind people that "opposites attract". God put you together for a specific purpose. Your differences are not points of division, but how God fits you together. The trick is to work together... and for this humility is the key. You may be the spiritual leader of your family, but you are also a broken sinner in daily need of God's grace. Each one of you has to gently remind the other (when he or she goes "off base"), HOW God would have us live. The other one, instead of getting all persnickety, should humbly say, "Thanks. I needed that." And then both of you smile, and somehow keep on going. THAT IS HARD WORK. IT COSTS... a LOT. But oh, how wonderful are the results in the end.
- 14. PRAY TOGETHER. This can never be stressed enough. The divorce rate of marriages in which husband and wife pray every night TOGETHER is pretty much nil. If you've never done it... start. The first night or two will be awkward. Maybe. But then.... oh, the spiritual rewards!

The custom of blessing candles on the Feast of the Presentation is an ancient custom in the Church. In 541 A.D. a candlelight procession be held throughout the cities on that Feast to implore Divine Protection against a pandemic. In answer to this holy gesture, God caused the pandemic and other disasters to subside. The faithful continued to use the candles as a means of Divine protection. This prompted the blessing of candles on the Feast of the Presentation which then were distributed to the faithful.
