As always, we will remain safe and vigilant, but let us consider returning to in-person participation, perhaps finding a new spot (other than the usual) in our large church to feel comfortable in the presence of our Lord....



Dear Parishioners Glory to Jesus Christ! Слава Iсусу Христу!

What are you willing to do when you're desperate or you when a "chance in a lifetime" presents itself and you sense that the window of opportunity will close soon? What would you be willing to do for a friend or a loved one? (It is usually easier for us to make great sacrifices or put our safety or reputation at risk if it is for the sake of someone else, not?). Well the men in today's Gospel would not take no for an answer and they were determined to find a way. They wanted to help a disabled man and they were willing to cause shock and incur ridicule. In the end they achieved what they wanted for the man, but the man and the crowd (and we all) got a lot more than what they imagined! What was the most shocking event in today's Gospel account? The men tearing open the roof? The miracle that Jesus performed? That Jesus read the thoughts of the Scribes? Or is it something that perhaps only the Scribes really understood at the moment and then had to make a life decision ...?

THE FOCUS OF THE WORLD IS ON UKRAINE

Does a day go by when we don't hear even more horrific news from/about Ukraine? Does a day go by in

which we don't join every person of good will around the world in praying our merciful Lord to end the war in Ukraine. We pray for the victims of war among the Ukrainian nation - the many civilians as well as the soldiers and volunteers that strive to defend the country against the wrath of the Russian military. We pray for a conversion of the hearts and souls of all those involved Yes of the people of Ukraine that they would draw even closer to God like never before.... But also of the Russian army and their leaders that they would stop this senseless and merciless killing and destruction... but We also pray for the Russian citizens that they would open their eyes and we pray for western leaders that they would fulfil promises of protection for Ukraine and that they would provide not only token, political aid, but the real protection and support that Ukraine needs now before it is too late.

I want to share with you a beautiful - albeit bitter-sweet - experience that I had just the other day on Friday. A former colleague at the Ukrainian Catholic University contacted me and asked if I would be able to celebrate a Divine Liturgy for a very worrying situation in Ukraine. A family of four - parents and two small children - that I also knew, was trying to escape a village in the Russian occupied area. They were stopped by Russian military. Their phones were confiscated and after a long hold up, they were allowed to go, but not before the soldiers painted the symbols of the Russian Military on the sides of their vehicle. The family feared that Ukrainian Army will presume it is a Russian vehicle and destroy it along the way. So, we prayed a worrisome, but beautiful Liturgy with Sr. Michaila leading the responses from here at BVM and about 5 refugee families, women and children, joining in the singing from Lviv and Peremyshyl. I received word today that the family got safely to... the city of Kyiv. Lord, have mercy.

7. More homework for everyone in our parish... we've been asked to participate in a petition effort in support of medical professionals that want to hold to their conscience... A card will be available next week at the back of the church to support Bill C-230. Usually we are asked to help FIGHT (bad) bills that are introduced in Parliament. Good news... *this* bill is a good one! It protects doctors, nurses and others from losing their licenses, jobs, and worse, if they refuse to help someone commit suicide. "Nobody's forcing them!" is the argument of some. Unfortunately that's not the case! Technically, the law does not require medical professionals to participate, but it also does not protect them if a hospital or the College of

Physicians and Surgeons *requires* them to participate. Bill C-230 protects medical professionals from being coerced, intimidated or forced to participate in euthanasia. However, you can send an online message of support here:
