PRAY FOR UKRAINE

Dear Parishioners Glory to Jesus Christ! Слава Ісусу Христу!

FIRST, a word of gratitude to our good Lord that saw to it that everything fell into place in a way that served all our parishioners and guests that were seeking spiritual renewal. The Parish Lenten Mission saw a good number of people make their "Lenten Confession" - taking advantage of the guest Priest - Father Daniel Wach, the Basilian Monk, who preached our Mission this year [great insights about the whole Annunciation event!]. We hosted a powerful event led by our Metropolitan Lawrence and Archbishop Stefan in conjunction with Pope Francis for the historic consecration of Ukraine and Russia. Thank you to our ladies that saw to wonderful refreshment hospitality throughout these two unforgettable days, the singers, the livestream techies, and our ever-ready Starshi Braty.

Every Saturday morning Myron Fedoruk, Jimmy Sawchuck and I change the three principal vigil lamps – one over the Altar ("Eternal Lamp") and two before the two "principal" icons of Christ and the Mother of God on our beautiful iconostas. I get to climb the ladder to the central candle which can be seen just above the iconostas and I hand Myron last-week's candle and insert and light the new one. As I climb the ladder there is a warning label at the top rung that says something to the effect of "do not ascend past this point or stand on the top rung". I sometimes think that this ladder experience (which probably all of us have had at some point) is similar to the "Spiritual Ladder" of St John that we are commemorating today. St. John's ladder is a step-by-step plan of purification of ourselves and growing in virtue and holiness to reach the heights that our Lord would have us do. The target height – according to God's Will, not ours - may be different for everyone to some degree, but it always means moving upward ... advancing toward a wonderful goal. There are perils... a misstep by not being completely attentive... trying to get away with using an old ladder

with weak rungs, or ... a ladder that can't deal with our weight, or.... we can choose the wrong ladder that won't get us to the point that we need. Reading the work of St. John Climacus would be a great source of meditation for anyone and it would us help to set a goal as to how we want to be climbing upward our entire lifetime. We can at least make a plan based our Christian-Catholic faith — and in collaboration with the Holy Spirit - as to how we will climb one rung at a time... perhaps first to get out the pit in which we find ourselves, but then to continue into a more dedicated life in Christ.

The message from the Gospel today can be very simplified. We hear of a terrifying account of a demon-possessed boy (see a video on our website). Finally Jesus, casts out the evil spirit and later gives the "secret" to his Apostles. Bigger challenges require bigger effort and personal investment.... "This kind can be cast out only by prayer..... and fasting" (Mark 9:29) This is part of our Lenten goal of more time in prayer, charity and FASTING.

The Steubenville conferences "bring together some of the best Catholic speakers and musicians in North America, and provide opportunities for high school teens to encounter Christ and experience the Church in a whole new way!" Any teens (and parent chaperones)
- 8. Something to think about... then let's talk. Where is Blessed Virgin Mary parish headed? Where is everyone?... the eager volunteers?the Altar Boys?... the Girls of Mary? Since the time of Christ, the Church and individual parishes thrived only by willing and enthusiastic VOLUNTEERS. Our parish is no exception! We need to come forward. Maybe you had the experience in younger years living at home when meal times would roll around and all the kids are preoccupied watching TV, playing some game or doing homework (heh, heh) and Mom would shout out, "It's supper time! Where is everyone!? Are you waiting for a special invitation!?". Well, if that's what you need to get involved in the parish, here it is: Dear, ___[Your Name here]_____ You are invited (and needed) by your Parish to offer (a wee bit of) Your time and/or talent! If anyone tells you, "no, we're good right now, maybe come back in a few weeks" then you spoke to the wrong person! Come see Fr. Michael or call the Office. (Hey, BTW, its the 21st Century... if the call goes to voicemail? LEAVE A MESSAGE! Someone WILL get back to you.)
 - 1) Altar boys.... Time to come back? Give Father your names (just phone the church, or meet him after Divine Liturgy) and let him know you're ready! He'll organize your schedule and let's start serving at the Altar of the Lord where your service is greatly needed.
 - 2) Girls of Mary Is there a leader (young adult? older adult) who would be at the church once a month for a 1.5 hour session with the girls? Millie Haligowski was a natural leader with them over past decades. (God bless you, Millie!) Who will do this now? Pray a little, sing a little, play a game.... and "bond as parish family"! Plus, we'd see the blue-caped girls during special services, such as when our Metropolitan comes to visit. And Majivky and often!
 - 3) An office helper for 1 hour or less on Fridays at 2 PM. (mostly with bulletin prep).
 - **4) Big-hearted people good with tools** who can come to fix the odd broken handle, jammed cupboard, change lights, look at a dripping faucet and help make decisions.... give us your phone numbers and be ready to help us out! There is an empty hole right now in this regard.
 - **5)** Another 'starshey brat' or two! May God bless Jimmy Sawchuk and Myron Fedoruk with many more years of good health and dedication in helping around the altar. But there should be several more to help on weekdays, Sundays, special events, funerals, etc. Are you a gentleman who could come before services to light the candles, carry kadylo and open the doors for Father? (It's really for God, you know.)
 - **6)** A Prayer Group leader who already prays, and understands the value of prayer, to hold a set prayer time every week at the same time, to pray for intentions given by our parishioners. A rosary? a holy half-hour? Up to you. But people would know that they can just come and join in at that time. **No one** has to be there every single time. **Everyone** can call in or text in prayer requests to that person beforehand. We just need a set time in our parish outside of Divine Liturgies that we show we are a true parish family by praying with and for each other.
 - **7) Refugee Assistance Volunteers –** And now we need volunteers who would serve as contact, driver, mentor, helper, baby-sitter, etc. etc. for when we receive families from wardevastated Ukraine. That could be in a matter of a week or two!.
