Blessed Virgin Mary Parish wishes you, your family -- and everyone near and dear to you and all those in your life -- a truly glorious, uplifting and life-changing Easter celebration! We have made it through the Lenten season and probably through many other more difficult challenges over the past year. We pause in this church on this Easter Sunday to contemplate the greatest feast of the year and the key event that highlights our Christian Faith. Our God, the one and only God, sent God the Son, our one and only Saviour Jesus Christ, to come into the word to live like one of us among us...then to die for us...and then rise from the dead on the third day. This God of ours sacrificed His life for the sake of His Creation. What God so loves his creatures that He is willing to offer himself as the only possible repayment for their sin? Jesus did this willingly (albeit with the same fears and anguish that we would experience), because of His unconditional and boundless love for each and everyone of us.

The typical Easter Icon for the Ukrainian Catholic Church really depicts the Descent into Hades/ Hell. As we look at the detail the Icon below, we can observe a few things: The golden panels under his feet are the gates of Hades, which He has broken and torn apart. Keys and locks are floating in the abyss below, symbolizing that He has entered and conquered both death and Hades. The two figures whom Christ has grasped and is pulling from tombs are Adam and Eve. This gesture symbolizes His victory which redeems all mankind, even back to the beginning. Christ freeing Adam and Eve out of Hades depicted in this icon can be seen as a visual metaphor for the mercy that God offers to all people, to all sinners who in genuine repentance and humility are lifted up out of darkness. Christ pulling up Adam and Eve is symbolic of our own dependence upon God, of our reliance on Him for everything, especially our salvation. We have no strength to "free"

ourselves by our own means, but rather we need God's helping hand. The source of our strength is always God. God offers us hope and never fails to love us, no matter how greatly we may fail in our weaknesses, even when we have fallen as low as Adam and Eve. Yes, the Resurrection of our Lord and the whole Easter Event is a new beginning for all

Humankind and for each of us. Let us take this to heart!

This EASTER.... now!... today!.... let us outstretch our hands and allow the Lord to grab hold of us and once and for all - pull us out of the darkness in which we sometimes dwell, or out the pit into which we have fallen and can't seem to get out. Allow Him to pull us into New life and live this life now only for Him

and His Will!

Did the Risen Jesus Appear FIRST to His Mother?

Q. Wouldn't Jesus have appeared to His mother after His resurrection? Why is there no *biblical account of that event?* Biblical commentators Α. have long speculated about this matter. Some think that Jesus didn't appear to Mary because her faith required no evidence of that sort for His resurrection. Others conjecture that the encounter happened, but knowledge of the event is not necessary for our salvation, so the Gospel writers passed over the incident in silence.

It is almost impossible to believe that Jesus would not have appeared to Mary first, given that she was His mother, she had suffered so much with Him and for His sake, and her role in the plan of redemption He was fulfilling was unequaled... The Evangelists remained silent about the event either because their immediate audience would have assumed it took place, or because the encounter was so intimate and profound that it was ... best left a private matter between the Son of God and His mother.

good-will to keep things on the rails... but sometimes you have to walk away

Our Holy Father asked the Catholic Church in all

countries to meet regularly for some time in a "Synodal" process of reflection for the space of a couple of years. Some (like our Ukrainian Catholic Church which has been meeting in Synods for decades) have, -- hopefully -- been doing so with real faith, and good will. Over the past years, not only bishops have been meeting, but they have been asking for more and more input from the laity, and if done with respect, and a desire to make the Lord known to all and loved by all, this can be a very good thing.

However, over the past two years, it seems as if we have been hearing ever worse news about the holy Catholic Church in Germany, with regard to its "Synodal Way". This "Synodal Way" was supposed to be a meeting of honest and faith-filled minds and hearts, but on February 22, 2023 four good women had had enough: They quit.

These were no "ordinary" women... though of course there is no such thing as an "ordinary woman". But these four Catholic women were highly-educated: two theology professors, a philosopher and a respected Catholic iournalist.

The Synodal Way "is casting doubt on central Catholic doctrines and beliefs..." They accused the organizers of ignoring the Vatican's repeated warnings and interventions... and of using "pressure tactics".

"The resolutions of the past 3 years have not only called into question essential foundations of Catholic theology, anthropology as well as Church practice, but have reformulated and in some cases. completely redefined them. We cannot and will not share responsibility for that."

Commentary: What if more of us -- calmly, respectfully, but seriously -- refused to participate in anything and everything that we knew, or sensed, was "not right"?

For instance, do you belong to a Board or Committee (hospital, school, library, workplace?) that is making not only poor, but anti-God decisions time after time? Are you a grandparent who is expected to drive your grandchild to an objectionable event? Are vou someone being coerced into helping with, or even just attending a wedding of a Catholic to someone who will very likely not bring up children in the Catholic faith? There are dozens of examples of times when we -- if we truly are serious about trying to come closer to God, and wish to bring others to Him -- must step back and say, "NO! I want no part of this. I will not do it." Like those brave women, who walked away from a prestigious Synod and possibly damaged their careers, we, too, can take courage and say: "We cannot and will not share responsibility for that." Everyone Loves a Good Story: "Just in Time for Easter"

The Dogwood tree is a beautiful little tree that explodes in white blossoms each spring and is a favorite blooming tree. It grows across the South and is popular as a yard tree, but it also grows wild in the woods the across region. The legend holds that the tree was once very large, like a Great Oak tree, and because its wood was strong and sturdy, it provided building material for a variety of purposes. According to the story, it was the dogwood tree that provided the wood used to build the cross on which Jesus was crucified.

Because of its role in the crucifixion, it is said that God both cursed and blessed the tree. It was cursed to forever be small, so that it would never grow large enough again for its wood to be used as a cross for a crucifixion. It's branches would be narrow and crooked--not good for building at all.

At the same time, however, the tree was blessed so that it would produce beautiful flowers each spring, just in time for Easter. To remember God's promise to the tree it is said he gave it a few traits so that whoever looks upon it will never forget.

The petals of the dogwood actually form the shape of a cross. Upon close examination, it can be seen that the blooms of

the tree alwavs have four petals. The middle of the Dogwood flower has a tight grouping of resembling a "crown of thorns." And the tips of each of the petals are indented, as if they bear a nail dent. There are even colors in the petals that bring to mind the drops of blood that spilled during the crucifixion. So there you have it. Happy Easter!
