Well, here we are not only half way through summer, but half way through the last month of summer! Now, I don't want to alarm anyone (especially students - as I remember the feeling from my younger days), but I just want us to face this reality and make the best of it. A little thought and planning and work as to how best to use these next weeks will go a long way.

First of all, if we are not outside at this moment, let's at least go to a window and look out at the sky and nature and whatever we can see and thank the Lord that He has given all this for us to enjoy!. Then let us think if we are ready for the beginning of the new Church Year (which begins September 1st) (and the School Year which begins about the same time). What do we need to get ready?....make a basic layout?...contact a few people?...select a date, time and place for the first event and maybe make a calendar of dates for other events throughout the Church year? Decide now that we will get as many people and NEW people involved as possible. An underlying goal will be to strive to pass leadership 'bulavas' and responsibility roles - as soon as *reasonably* possible - to other people. Just spending some time on this already puts us ahead of the game to avoid the mad rush at the beginning of September.

Now for our salvation goals -- the most important thing: Let's make plans to "psych ourselves up" over the next couple of weeks for a great year ahead. As a Ukrainian Catholic, I want to explore and live my faith and the mandate of the our Lord to the full! I can start asking for God's Grace - through prayer - that I and my household/family will have a whole new attitude come September: in-person participation for Sunday Liturgy... getting involved with one of the organizations or groups in the parish... not just lamenting about what's missing, but talking with my pastor about my dreams and seeing if we can't get something going... spending more time in the presence of God in the beauty of my parish church (as opposed to rushing in and exiting within nanoseconds of the beginning and end of the service)... In other words, let's strive for an attitude shift in how we view Christ's Church, our Parish and our personal role in both of those living realities. BUT, yes, in the meantime let's MAKE time to smell the roses, go for a walk, have lunch/supper outside, turn off those addictive screens and spend real time with real people, especially those people who really need us -- whether or not they know it or would admit it -- and enjoy real life, not the manufactured or even fake life of the media.

(One of the pious traditions of our people has us drying out these flowers and keeping them to put later in the coffin under the head of a family member who has died. The reasoning is that Our Lady, who so loves us and wants to take us to heaven, will look down kindly upon the soul who now reposes on the flowers blessed in her honour, and will take him/her swiftly into heaven.)
- 2. Only ONE Divine Liturgy will be celebrated in our church at 9 AM next week (Cooks Creek Archeparchial Pilgrimage weekend). This will give people time to attend, plus go to the Cooks Creek D.L. at 11:30 AM. (See pilgrimage schedule elsewhere in this bulletin.)


