Sunday of Holy **Forefathers**

December 11, 2022 Неділя св. Праотців

"You said Thanks, but no thanks!? Are you serious!?

As we move rapidly toward the feast of the Nativity of our one and only Lord and Saviour Jesus Christ the Son of God, the Church prescribes a Gospel reading where Jesus teaches with a parable about a banquet. A massive, eternal banquet has been prepared for us by God [This is what He wanted for us from the beginning, but then we blew it through our greed and stupidity as exhibited by Adam and Eve.] God the Father, sent many prophets over the ages to show His undiminished love and to assure us that we are still His and that He wants us to live in the joy of His grace no matter what [This is described by Jesus in the parable of the vineyard (Matthew 21:33-41)]. Then, He sends His only-begotten Son Who, although being "One with God", agreed to take upon Himself the status of a servant (and agrees to even die for us), because of the amazing love that God - the Father, Son and Holy Spirit - has for us. So, in the light of that, we might find the excuses that the invited guests give as rather shockingly shallow and unbelievable. The Lord tells this parable for us to take certain lessons to heart. We have been invited and now, we should be ready to join in the banquet. There is nothing more important in our lives than the banquet. If wealth, daily concerns, certain relationships, etc. might cause us to say, "well, not right now" or "no thanks", then we have missed the significance of the invitation [or, worse, we are determinedly making a judgement call that the things of the Lord are not as important as the things of the world or of my little life in particular.]


This parable in the Gospel of St. Matthew (22:1-14) is told with varying details (some Biblical scholars believe it to be similar, but really a different parable). Besides dwelling on what the state of affairs is at the time of Jesus' public earthly ministry, the parable in Matthew is even more clearly a message to us as well about the future judgement.

In Matthew it speaks of a guest who actually finally did come to the banquet, but came insincerely and disrespectfully. He thought he could "come as he is"

(this might work for A&W, but not for the Lord). We're not talking about wearing one's "Sunday best", but about the fact that the quest didn't want to *change* and *better himself* and repent and be worthy of putting on the "wedding garment" of a new life. He thought he could walk in with his dirty old jeans and t-shirt of living life as he wants to, and not prepare himself to come in his best and show gratitude and respect to the host for inviting him to this amazing banquet which is not only the banquet of the century, but the only real banquet. i.e. it is not a one-off major event, but it is the only eternal banquet of salvation with the Lord. He is soon easily discovered (as we would be at the heavenly

banquet in the company of the saints and angels) and is called out on his insolence - to which he has no possible answer - and he is tossed out.

As this banquet is eternal, he is tossed out into the darkness (that he ultimately chose for himself) for an eternity. For us what is the practical message!? Come on and let us prepare well for Christmas by taking *care of our souls* as much as our gift lists and filling our freezers with two-weeks of great food. This Wednesday we have a special Confessions and prayer evening from 6 to 8 PM. With visiting priests. We also want to prepare the services and the carols well - to glorify the Newborn King in a manner He deserves. Thanks to our volunteers who have already decorated the Church inside and out in readiness for the holiday. It's truly is starting to look a lot like Christmas!
