#### **Dear Parishioners:**

#### Christ is born! Glorify Him! Христос Рождається! Славіте Його!

This is our first Sunday in the new year. We find ourselves within the third decade of the third millennium since the birth of our loving Lord and Saviour Jesus Christ. This is also, of course, the year in which we celebrate the first century of our parish! Periods of time, of course are somewhat irrelevant, except they do help us to gauge progress and they help us to compare one period with another period long ago or in a different part of the world. They also give us a reading of where we are now as compared to 10, 20 or, say, 50 years ago. Are we growing or declining? And the growth or decline may refer to various things. On a personal level, it may refer to health, weight, hair, knowledge, spiritual life, Gospel living, etc. On a collective level for, say, as parish, it could mean: size in number of parishioners, financial stability, Liturgical services, faith, efforts at Gospel living, Evangelization, charitable programs, etc.

What does this passage from 2021 into 2022 tell us? On a personal level, we would want to make that assessment as honestly as possible before the Lord and perhaps looking into a mirror. We are certainly a year older. We may have a lot that we would want to complain about, but if we look deeper into matters and try to see things with the eye of God, we will also see a lot for which we would be grateful. As a parish, we will be looking back – not only over 2021, but over the last 100 years - to review the amazing and glorious moments, the tough periods and, well maybe even the shortcomings and some "if only we had" recollections as well. But the great news every new year (every new morning for that matter) is that as the sun rises, we are beginning the rest of our lives! So, let's concentrate on that. There are lessons to be learned from the mistakes and successes of the past. We hopefully will learn them! But there are a lot of opportunities to do great and wonderful things by the help of God and by the help of our fellow parishioners and all our "Neighbours" (Mark 12:31; Luke 10:25 ff). So, let's take a deep breath and ask our Lord to be our guide from here on forward. Let is

start to live a better life in all aspects! Through healthier living,... healthy relationships,... a stronger and more consistent prayer life. Many people promote a "full body cleanse" to rid oneself of all the accumulated toxins and start afresh. Let's do that, but also a "full soul cleanse". We have built up toxins within us that keep us poisoned and unhealthy. Things like dishonesty with ourselves and others. Things like inappropriate relationships that keep us shackled or keep us from growing. Things like addictions to foods, substances, social-communications, tv. Things like staying with old habits and refusal to accept or even seek change because of laziness or fear or apathy. In life, over time, we can get into ruts and not even know it. A new year is an opportunity to make a bold step forward with the Lord to become the person



that Our Lord knows that we can be and wants us to be. The Lord will help us! Let us help each other.

"YORDAN" January 6th - In the Ukrainian Christian tradition, the symbolism of Jordan water is closely connected with the memory of the Baptism of Rus-Ukraine by Grand Prince Volodymyr. The river Dnipro, in which the people of Kyiv were baptized, is figuratively called the "Ukrainian Jordan." On the feast of Theophany in Ukraine, an ice cross is erected as a sign and a memorial of baptism; during the Great Blessing of Water, three triple-branched candles are immersed into the waters. Bringing the holy water home, the faithful partake of it at the beginning of the Theophany Eve supper Shchedryi vechir (Ukrainian, meaning Abundantly Generous Eve). They bless their homes and farms, and keep the water throughout the year to partake of it, and to bless themselves in times of difficulty and illness. (Christ our Pascha, 202)
