Every week that we journey deeper into our Second Century makes us all the more excited, because of the possibilities that unfold before us every turn that we make!

The first thing we need to do is reduce the frequency by which we engage in unhelpful reminiscing about the past "glory days". Yes, our Parish when it started off, and when society was very different, was a hub of social and cultural as well as spiritual activity! There were hundreds of more registered members. To paraphrase an oldie that we still like to sing when making long drives or sitting around a campfire: "The old grey [BVM] ain't what she used to be... many long years ago!". Well, maybe that's true, but.... our parish truly has a lot of potential if we are ready to smell the coffee (i.e. wake up) and be honest with

ourselves (about where we are and where we should be), and make a commitment to putting a little more elbow grease into ministries and projects that COULD be worthwhile in our neighbourhood, and that ARE necessary if we are to survive our times and to make a useful contribution to the Church and the society around us.

NEXT WEEK is our parish "annual general meeting" (AGM). It is an essential gathering that we should have every year to accomplish certain 'formalities' that we need to accomplish as a juridic person every year - both canonically (as part of the Church) and civilly (as part of Manitoba society). This includes: reviewing and accepting the minutes from last year's AGM, reviewing and accepting our financial statement, hearing and accepting a few reports like that of the Chair of the parish council, and electing a few essential administrative officers (chair, treasurer and secretary). Many parishes add even more to the agenda: reports from parish organizations, a bit of discussion about major projects and repairs that may be visible on the near horizon, some sharing of ideas about pastoral/spiritual goals, etc.

So, what might be on our mind (and many of these ideas have been expressed by parishioners over the last a concerted effort to invite back all our **former parishioners** (especially those who aren't really involved with an church at this time)...inviting all our neighbours for several blocks around our church to come check us out and join us (with a plan and commitment to assure them that they are welcome); build a small, essential seniors' complex on the site of the old hall or present parking lot; build a palliative care centre on the site of the old hall or present parking lot; establish a sadochok/daycare on our parish premises; open a small café/drop-in centre on our parish premises or at a near-by location; These are essential - because a growth in the number of people/members is essential for programs to be implemented for: Seniors; Youth; Young-Adults; Knights of Columbus; soup kitchen; Adult-Catechism; sports team; parish pilgrimage to local shrine or to Europe or Holy Land; helping refugees; prayer group; liturgical movement; sick/hospital visits; visits to care homes and shutins; choir; and this is only scratching the surface. See you next Sunday at our AGM! Surely we'll leave inspired!

- 7. 2023 Week of Prayer City-wide Ecumenical Worship Service to be held at 7:30 pm TONIGHT at Saint John XXIII Church, Winnipeg.
- 8. The persecution and murder of Christians continues in Nigeria. Are you praying? This past Sunday, we at Blessed Virgin Mary were praying and singing peacefully in church, but the Catholics in the Paikoro area in Niger state were horrified to come and find their church rectory burned, and to be told that their priest Rev. Isaac Achi was dead: he had been burned as well, in his rectory. His assistant, Fr. Collins Omeh, who is now recovering in the hospital, suffered multiple gunshot wounds while he narrowly escaped the terrorists in the rectory compound. He tells us: 'The bandits, who were about 15 in number, came fully armed and shooting sporadically in the air shouting 'Allahu Akbar' [God is great].'

The priest said that in the middle of the night, he was confronted at gunpoint in his living quarters inside the rectory compound, and ordered to climb through a hole created in the ceiling, and then to take the terrorists to Fr. Achi.

But the men initially had difficulty gaining access to Achi's quarters, and began shooting their weapons in all directions. Achi was shot in the leg, Omeh said, and the parochial vicar was shot in the hand.

The two priests were then held at gunpoint by the terrorists,. They began praying together, and offered one another the sacrament of confession, Omeh said."

Initial reports said that Fr. Achi was burned to death, when terrorists set fire to his rectory. Fr. Omeh told The Pillar that Achi was first shot in the chest, and his body was then burned when the rectory was set





Blessed Sister Olympia Bida (a Sister of St. Joseph) in 1950 was leading, along with another Sister, a simple life in a Ukrainian village not far from Lviv. Though they did their best to support parish life, World War II had done much damage, and now the NKVD were harassing all opponents to Communism. The parish priest was eventually arrested and "disappeared", and, when an Orthodox "priest" was installed, the Sisters refused to attend the local church anymore. Instead, the local Catholics were delighted that the Sisters would lead little prayer services, especially Moleben, in the nearby cemetery. Eventually the two Sisters were arrested and deported to Tomsk, Siberia. They were assigned to labour in the surrounding forests, and also cared for a local man with tuberculosis when no one else wanted to come near. Thus they lived for two years... Sr. Olympia died in Jan. 1952 while Sr. Laurentia Harasymiw (who by this time had a festering leg wound) died later that fall. Srs. Olympia & Laurentia, intercede for us!
