The Scripture readings prescribed for today – both the Epistle and the Gospel for the Sunday after the Theophany – give a strong message of "**LET'S GET BUSY!**" The Apostle Paul tells the Ephesians that Jesus is taking care of His Church and he provides us with gifted and talented people that we need to maintain and grow the Church. What is your God-given gift or talent that you will use to build our parish into a thriving family/community that it is meant to be? Then Jesus in the Gospel reading gives us the initial proclamation that we all must have in our hearts and on our lips to be constantly declaring and

sharing to everyone around us until the Lord comes again,... "Repent, for the kingdom of

heaven is at hand!" Let us continue to celebrate and, yes, enjoy Christmas and this festal season within our Church year, but let's just make it much more real than it has ever been and *let's get busy*!

Announcements!

 Holy water is available at the front of the church. You may pick some up for your family today after services – the bottles are labeled. Keep it in an accessible place, and remember to use it! ... for health, for security, etc. But first sprinkle every room in your house as per our tradition, and per our faith and trust in the Lord who has given us these sacramentals through His holy Church.



2. Today – we distribute the holy 'Prosphora' (bread and honey). Usually, we do this during our parish "Christmas dinner", but since Covid regulations prevent us

Again, Sylvia Romanchuk lovingly baked and cut the bread, added the honey, and carefully packed it into the special individual containers (needless to say, taking Covid precautions all the while). This prosphora has been blessed by Father Michael, who would normally distribute it at the parosh dinner, but now we invite those attending church services on Sunday to please take a container for themselves and for those in their home and to prayerfully consume the BVM Parish prosphora
