

"Can't be Done"? Time to Think Beyond the App!*

Today's Gospel has inspired generations of Christians because of its obvious messages of: 1. the loving **forgiveness** of our God and Saviour Jesus Christ who came into the world to bring life and salvation to all people (especially those who bother to ask in humility) and 2. the importance of the **faith** of the man and his friends who bring him to Jesus. Let us also consider another message that may be so obvious that it's missed: he **creativity** and **boldness** of the friends who want to get the man to Jesus at all costs, precisely because they have **faith** in Jesus' loving **forgiveness!** We so often see a need of changes or opportunities in our personal selves, or our

marriages or our family or our parish, but we lack the courage and dedication to make them happen. We know ourselves how easy it is to "talk ourselves down" from doing something that we were originally excited about and felt good about, because it truly would be great if we could do it! But then we start to over think it (or are too lazy to think it through well) and we consider the consequences: What if it doesn't work? What will people say? It may require life changes and long-term dedication! We start to "feel the wind" and "see the waves" around us that we didn't really notice before, like St. Peter who actually did start to walk on water, and we get scared... we lose faith in ourselves and the Lord Who inspires us.

We see that even in our parishes and parish organizations. When a proposal is raised, too often the first song that is sung (and not totally unjustified) is the litany of why it would be too difficult and why it "can't be done". And time and again, rather than embracing the challenge of necessary change and figuring out how to make it happen and how a new life can be ushered in, the inspiration and enthusiasm is allowed to fizzle and is aborted. The friends in today's Gospel were convinced that their handicapped friend could be helped by Jesus in some way. Perhaps healed, perhaps blessed, perhaps simply given powerful words of encouragement that would shed new light on his struggles and suffering, which would give him the purpose to carry on. **But they had determined not to walk away until they tried every possibility.** Their faith and just human logic told them that they had not really tried everything yet. And the need of their friend was real. They could not simply say to themselves, "Well, it couldn't be done", "We were too late", "We didn't expect the crowds to be so massive", "People were already giving us dirty looks and telling us to stop making a fuss", "People will mock us", etc. No. They had a cause that was worth it (as we have so many causes that are worth it) and they went for it. They decided to face the possibility of failure. They likely would have to pay for the repairs to the roof. There was a slight possibility that Jesus might not do anything and, on the other hand, that they would be ridiculed by some, BUT, they also felt deep down that... probably not. No matter what happened, their sincere and dedicated efforts would be rewarded in some way somehow. They wanted to do something good. They know that they HAD to do something or they would be losing a fantastic opportunity for their friend and they would be betraying the inspiration that they received from the Lord. The next time we are tempted to tell ourselves or others, "Too hard!" or "That can't be done!", let us take a closer look. *Is it a worthy or necessary cause? Then ... how can we make it happen?!* **Fr. Michael**



GIVE UP BEING A WIMP.

Are you a wimp?

Our Lord Jesus was no wimp. He ate what was given Him. (Wimps whine and complain.) He wore what His Mother sewed him. He almost certainly spoke up for bullied classmates.

When He grew up, He taught His apostles to be men. He gave good example in His speech and conduct. He stood up for widows and orphans. When there was a terrible storm on the sea, He turned over and kept on sleeping. He played with children when what He really needed was peace and quiet and a rest. Tradition has it that He and his apostles didn't just walk into a village and start preaching, but they looked around to see what needed fixing... and started fixing it. That always drew a crowd of interested bystanders... and then the preaching could begin. (Wimps whine about never being given the "opportunity".)



Jesus didn't shy away from enemies who kept attacking Him, but engaged bravely with them. He didn't shy away from speaking out about problems like divorce. And NO ONE has ever died like Jesus, as the target of such hatred and pain and torture.
