The Good Samaritan

This period leading up to Christmas, as we well know, is a time for 'fasting', special attention to our 'prayer' and sharing our wealth, however modest it may be, with individuals and causes in

'almsgiving'. For most of us, a great first step would be 1. not consuming more than we really need to be healthy (Do I really need that second serving?); 2. going beyond a minimalist attitude and developing a regular prayer life (a daily prayer routine that includes Sunday Liturgy attendance and praying at home every day when getting up in the morning, before calling it a night at the end of the day and praying before every meal. Doing this together with everyone in my home is 100 times better!); and then 3. we're all scraping our loonies together for our own needs month by month, but then.... there's always someone more in need than even we are, не так? Can we maybe save up our change to give at the end of the month to a local or national charitable organization that feeds or defends or helps those who are helpless?

In today's parable of the Good Samaritan there are so many profound images and lessons. Some aspects in particular somewhat shock us: 1. A priest actually just walks by?! He sees the situation, but perhaps tells himself that "I don't have time right now. I'm on my way to a service", or "if I touch this bloody, dirty man, I'll become unclean and can't perform my rituals at the Altar". All this may be true, but a man possibly dying in the ditch should get our immediate attention, not? and the Lord will provide for the rest. 2. The Levite (equivalent to, say, a parish council member in our day) does the same thing, perhaps thinking, "That's not part of my job description, I'm supposed to be doing things at the church". 3. But the real shocker should be who does actually help the person? It's a Samaritan and he helps not just by calling 911 on his cell and driving on, but by 'getting his hands dirty' (and getting his ride dirty by loading up the bleeding, beaten man into it), and he even sacrifices his time and money to be sure that the beaten man is left in good hands and taken care of. AND he even pays for it all from his own pocket! The kicker is that that the **Samaritan** doesn't normally care for people like the man in the ditch, because the man in the ditch (and his people) on any other day probably

wouldn't even give the Samaritan a second look, and if he did, it would probably be a dirty look. Samaritans were considered to be people who didn't have the right lineage and having religious and cultural practices that were not acceptable to the man in the ditch. THAT'S THE CORE LESSON. Someone in need is our brother, our sister, our mom and our dad. Regardless of what we may have against them, when they are in need of aid, kindness, consolation, faith or support... we do what we can. And the seemingly little "that we can" is often more than enough. It is a million times better that walking by and doing nothing!

Some people from our parish attended a presentation this past Thursday at the Centre Culturel Franco-Manitobain. It was an *update* given by **Alex** Schadenburg of the Euthanasia Prevention Coalition about the push
