Слава Ісусу Христу! Glory to Jesus Christ!

As we quickly approach one of the highlights of our Centenary year - the October 16th Eucharistic Liturgy with our Shepherd and Archbishop Metropolitan Lawrence and a celebratory banquet -- we take account of how blessed we are that it takes place in the month of October. Yesterday, October 1st, we celebrated the great Marian feast of the **Protection of the Mother of God**. Of course, this year, we will celebrate this feast with our whole parish and with our many guests in a suitable way on October 16th. This Feast acknowledges the many time that we as individuals (and as a whole nation) have turned to Mary, seeking her protection, and she came through for us.



The Feast of the Protection of the Mother of God (*October 1st or 14th old calendar*) always received the special devotion of the famous cossacks (козаки) of Ukraine and in recent years (2015) this day was re-establish and officially established as the official feast and holiday for those who defend Ukraine (День Захисника України).

Besides this being the month of our Marian parish Praznyk, it is also historically a month dedicated to Mary. The Archeparchy of Ivano-Frankivsk reminds us that on October 16th twenty years ago, Pope St John Paul II issued a pastoral letter about the Rosary, entitled "**The Rosary of the Virgin Mary**", and declared a "**Year of the Rosary**" in 2002. It was that same time that the Pope added another set of "mysteries" to the Rosary, called the "**Luminous Mysteries**" ("Mysteries of Light"). Long before that special year, the Church regarded October as the Month of the Holy Rosary. Probably in large part due to the simplicity and beauty of the prayer, the Rosary has grown to become a part of the life of countless parishes, clergy and families. Most of us surely have the experience of a regular praying of the Rosary as a family either daily or otherwise regularly. That old adage made famous by the Irish-American priest Fr. Patrick Payton who is famous for promoting the Rosary is so very true: "The Family that Prays Together, Stays Together!" As we prepare for our joyful mid-October centenary celebration, let's also make the commitment to come a bit earlier to our Liturgies and participate in the praying of the Rosary. Let's start the habit of praying not only with our Parish Family, but in our own families.

Do you remember how excited we all were when Pope **Saint John Paul II** visited Ukraine and actually acknowledged the countless men and women – laity, religious, monastics and clergy – that sacrificed their lives, because of their unwavering live for their Lord and His Church!? He didn't recognize ALL of them, but he made an amazing start by declaring BLESSED almost thirty deserving individuals.

He also declared BLESSED the co-founder of the **Sisters Servants of Mary Immaculate** – **Sister Josaphata**, who, although **not** a Martyr, lived a **heroic life** according to the Gospel teachings of Christ and Mission of the Church. Her cause for “canonization” was a natural next step. To be declared “**Saint** Josaphata” there must be clear evidence that, through her intercession, a miraculous event took place – especially a cure from a serious or potentially fatal illness. However, we must pray too! Do we have faith!? The Lord, Who performed countless miracles during His earthly ministry, often said what?... “**Your faith has healed you! Go...**”

Let us pray that all our ‘Blesseds’ will soon be found worthy of being declared as Saints so that we and the whole Church may take courage in their example and confidently request their intercession. Right now... this month – let our faithful individually and within our parishes get to know Blessed Josaphata better. Let us raise a fervent and frequent prayer for her intercession for our personal needs, our parish and Church needs, for Ukraine!

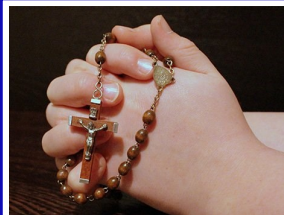

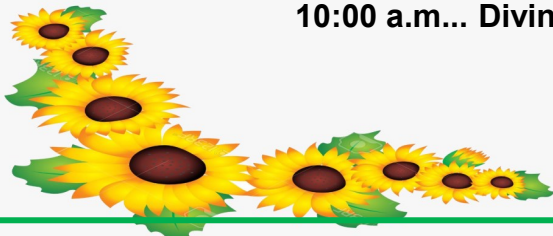

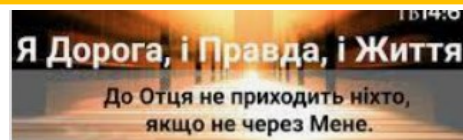
