**So, what would we do?**

**What would I do?**

Sometimes we hear it said (or we say it ourselves), "if I would win the lottery, I would do this, that or the other things to make a difference in my world or to promote the Gospel way of life..." or perhaps. "Oh sure, if I had his/their money I, too, would do great things!". Maybe..., but that's a big maybe. What the Lord wants us to understand today is that we should simply accept what the Lord gave us at this point in

our lives and *run with it* as best we can. Yes, perhaps, our goals and projects would be more easily accomplished if we had a big portion or all of the necessary funds already at our disposal. But we can also build up the necessary funds and materials in good time. If the project or goal is worth pursuing, then we will plug away day by day and get more people on board and gather the funds and materials needed. Yes, it may take more work and it may take more time, but it will be done in the end and..... more often than not.... the results will be much more longer lasting. (see the delightful story on page 4). The Lord will judge us on what we accomplish and for our pure motives. We need not compare ourselves with others over the amount that they made or gave. In today's parable, the two that increased the money entrusted them—basically doubled what they had. The person with one talent could have done the same and would have received equal praise as the ones who had more to begin with! We are tempted to give up even before beginning, because we see that what we need to do is a huge goal. Where will we get the support? How will be convince the people? Where will be get the funds to compete with the funds and resources that the opposition seems to have in abundance? We pray and we discern that the goal that we feel so strongly in our souls is a righteous goal and the Will of our Lord. Then we start working on it. The Lord will give us the wherewithal to succeed. But sometimes he wants us to really understand how important the matter is and why its worth promoting bit by bit, day by day until more and more people get on board. **One struggle that we might take as an example is the Pro-Life cause.** In our country and across our southern border, abortion was imposed by power, wealth and great deal of deception - not by a choice of the people, but by the decision of

a few. This came about in the countries that claim their goal is government "of the people, by the people, and for the people". Well, in the US a supreme court decision, based on faulty information and premises, thrust abortion upon the land. The same court (the same authority, albeit different judges) recently reversed its decision that had affected the country for decades and cost the lives of some **63 million babies**. Oh, the struggle isn't over, but at least now the cause is somewhat more fair in that people will now be able to hear the truth and will have to make decisions on their own whether they want to protect life or continue with abortions. It will take a lot of work and a great deal of money would help to get the truth out, but it also got out little by little over the last 50 years... by people doing what they could with what little they had..



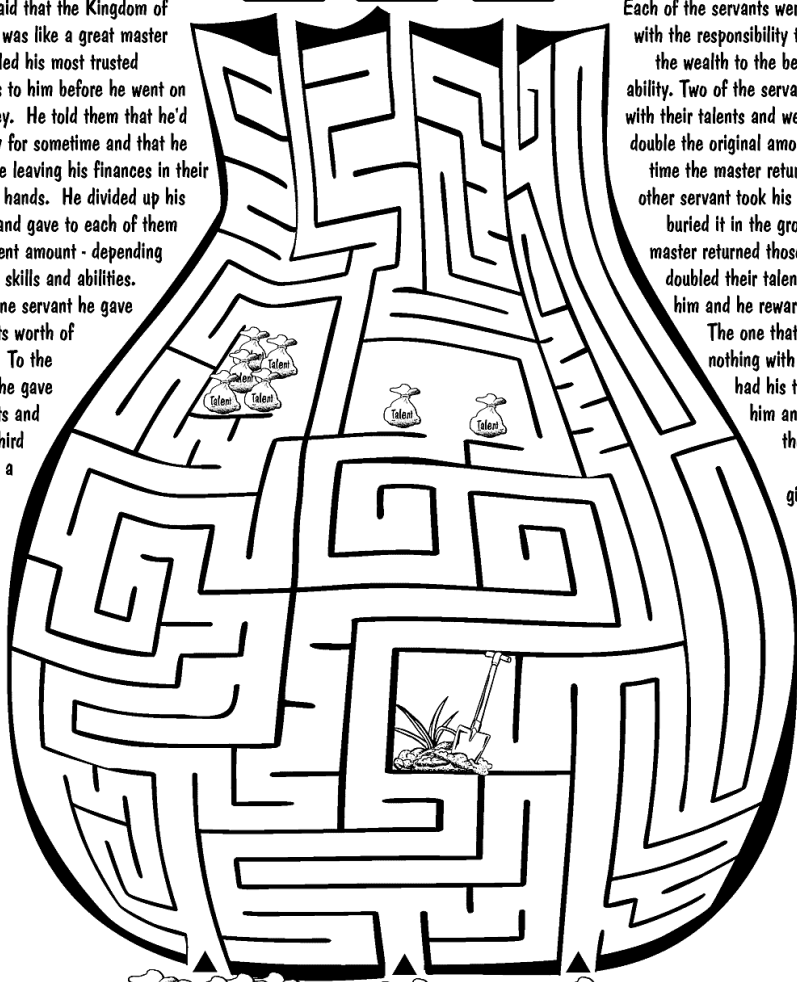
# The Ten Talents

To one servant he gave 5 talents worth of wealth. To the second he gave 2 talents and to the third he gave a single talent.

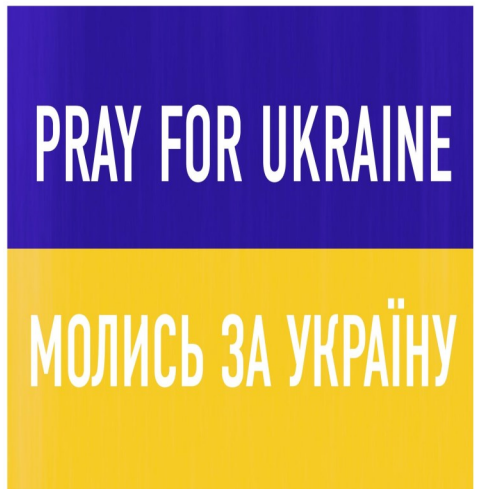

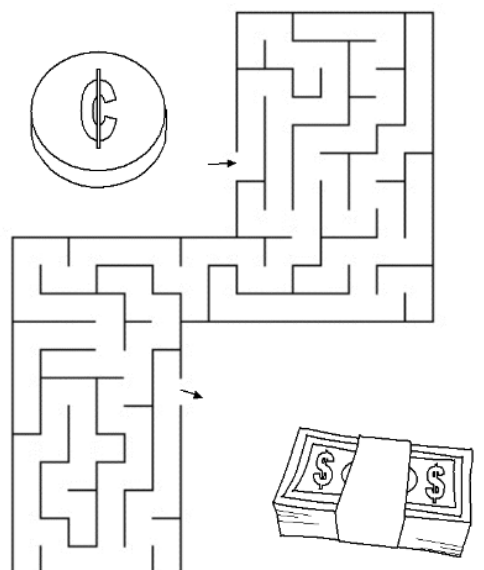

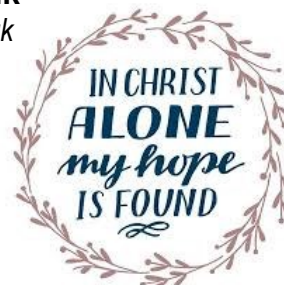
