ХРИСТОС ВОСКРЕС!CHRIST IS RISEN!

The founder of the Jesuits, St. Ignatius, in his famous "Spiritual Exercises" offers as one of his meditations the eventual **great divide of the world into two armies** gathered on a massive battlefield. They are gathered under two different banners: outside Jerusalem at the throne of Christ, and outside Babylon at the throne of Lucifer, the enemy of Christ and His People. Of course this battle is a final decision, a struggle that we must all face in life. But before things become so decisively a "point of no return", we can and must be open to seek and want the truth and the peace and joy that comes with it. We most commonly arrive at the truth by thinking, praying and by talking! Without honest communication and honest expression we set ourselves up for failure and harm and a lifetime (even an **eternity**) of hurt.

We have probably all been in a situation where we really wanted something or to do something and we didn't want to be talked out of it. We made up a logic in our minds that seemed iron clad - or pretty convincing, to us anyway - and we didn't want to have that "logic" chipped away at or undermined. Why? Because we really wanted to do what we wanted to do and were unwilling to give a fair hearing of points of view (or solid TRUTH) that might deny us from getting wat we wanted. But... what if what we wanted would cause us great pain or harm? What if what we wanted right now would sooner or later cause us and other people serious harm and heartache and suffering? How simple and selfish would we have to be to say "I don't care!" "I don't want to hear it!" "Not from you!" etc.?

Well, our fallen human nature gives us that tendency. Granted, life circumstances CAN put us into a certain mindset or deal us with a bad hand of cards. But, eventually, as painful as it may be for the short term, we want to give truth a chance. We want to allow the voice of God to reach our hearts

and allow the Holy Spirit to shed light on our life-choices and attitude that is really not taking us to the heights that the Lord wills for each of us. Before we entrench ourselves in a battle to the death against truth and against the author or truth - our Lord - as depicted in St. Ignatius' meditation above, we need to ask the Lord for the humility to honest. Before we make an almost irreversible decision against nature and logic and truth (like some are doing with their bodies in our day, or by entering into destructive relationships, etc.) we want to give truth a chance. Yes, sometimes we are not thrilled with the conduit by how that truth comes to us, but we still want to hear it and know is and let it set us free! (John 8:32).



The woman at the well today was initially uncomfortable, even a bit tart with Jesus today, because she perceived that He was a Jew and she didn't want to hear anything from a Jew who she knew didn't like "her kind" much. However (thank God) **she engaged in a conversation and what happened?! The truth started to come out. Jesus - an example to us all - spoke truthfully and firmly, but with respect and compassion.** The woman got this. She too, rather than running away or dissing Jesus, mustered the courage and humility to engage Jesus in a conversation. What a wonderful outcome! She not only embraced the truth (with great relief we can imagine), but she brought her neighbours to the same experience. This could have never happened except for the willingness of the Samaritan woman to actually talk with this Jewish man and hear Him out. And, on the other side, for this Jewish man (Who happened to be the Messiah and the Son of God) to be willing to talk respectfully to this woman and help her arrive at the truth. **We truly need to talk more! ... humbly and honestly.**



"O Blessed Mother Mary, Help Me!!!"

Not all that long ago, in Kansas, USA, the founder of a Benedictine Abbey there (now

the Benedictine College) wrote about a wonderful prairie miracle.

Father Henry Lemke wrote in his diary about an 1856 incident where he was lost in a storm and prayed for Mary's intercession. As soon as he said the prayer, a light appeared on the horizon. He stumbled toward it and found that it was a lantern hanging in the window of a cottage.

The mother and daughter who lived in the cottage sheltered him and told him that a lady dressed in white had appeared to the child in the night. This had awakened the mother, who hung the lantern.

Wrote Lemke: "O, you dearest Mother of God, it was through the pure and unsullied soul of a child that you effected that the mother would place a lamp in the window just about the very time when I was calling out for help because I feared for my life. The Mother of God worked a miracle."

Two years later, Benedictine College was founded.

And another delicious twist: Only two years later -- in 1858 -the "lady dressed in white" appeared to *another* little girl in a small town, but this time on the other side of the ocean.....St. Bernadette of Lourdes, France.
