#### **Dear Parishioners!**

What is going on?! The world was shocked when Russian brutally invaded Ukraine well over a year ago and has remained in a state of disbelief as the war and atrocities continue to this day. Then we were all witness to terrifying, well, *terrorist* attacks in Israel where over 2500 have been killed with unthinkable things being done to people - mostly civilians including women and children. And now, counter attacks.

In the middle of these wars, the vast majority of victims are everyday civilians like ourselves being killed, violated, losing homes and everything and being forced to flee, perhaps forever. The danger is that we will shake our heads for a few days and talk about it as a welcome new topic for our chats with friends and relatives, and then set it aside and go on with our regular busy lives. We can so easily become complacent unless it is happening to us. or literally on our block. Only then might we get concerned and deem it worthy of our serious attention and prayer. What we don't think about is how did these countries and these peoples arrive

at a point where either they are so filled with pain and hatred towards each other that they are willing to lash out in such violence? How did they allow themselves to become so complacent and unvigilant that enemies could attack, invade and attempt to destroy them? And the bigger question is always: Why would God allow this?

I am certainly not going to try to attempt to propose an answer to the last question (Why, God?) in the space of a bulletin message. However, at such times, we can turn to Lord and raise out hearts and prayers to God to awaken us and convert us (and our enemies) and grant us a true and faith-rooted peace. But for some reason our world is in a real faith slump right now. Probably because we have lost our faith. We have lost our faith in the purpose and power of prayer, and, it is almost as if we don't care if the Lord answers our prayer. We are lost in our own little lives and in the things that we do; things that we have decided are "good enough" and are more important than allowing a living faith to guide and inspire us and our lives. For example, and I don't say this with anger or cynicism, but we are having an hour of prayer this Tuesday in our own parish church for an end to the vicious wars in the Holy Land and Ukraine, but.... I am not holding my breath that many (if any?) will be there. Sure, we're concerned about these wars and the countless people killed or who otherwise have their lives destroyed, but we have lunch plans, hair appointments, a show to watch, work to be done, shopping to do, previous plans, or we just don't feel like altering our daily routine, etc. Such things will take precedence. We so easily become complacent and/or we allow world values to overshadow and direct our Catholic Christian values of faith and family. This happens concerning many things that, at first, rightly shocked us, things that we never accepted, but we still become

No one expected me to Walk- I walk (mostly I run:P)


No one expected me to speak - I spoke

### **That Sanctuary Lamp** Hanging Over our Altar

"Take a word. Put the power of a poet behind it, and it will make music, beauty and cadence and will sing in the hearts of men. Put the power of an orator behind it, and it will thrill vast multitudes. Put the power of a judge behind it, and it spells the difference between innocence and guilt; between



Take a piece of bread. Put the power of a cook behind it, and it may become bread pudding. Put the power of God, expressed in a few words, behind it, and it is transfigured into the Body and Blood, Soul and Divinity of our glorified Lord and Saviour Jesus Christ.

What is determinative, decisive and all-important is not so much the word as it is the power behind the word. When infinite power and intelligence are put behind the word, it becomes the plenipotentiary ambassador of the Most High, clothed with a divine efficacy which transcends the power of man as the radiance of the sun surpasses the flickering light of a candle.
