- 1. No Catechism tonight... we will resume catechism classes next Sunday (see times elsewhere in this bulletin).
- 2. Blessed Virgin Mary Parish Council meeting tomorrow (Monday), Nov. 1st at 5:30 PM in the classroom space.
- 3. Our Blessed Virgin Mary UCWL will meet this Tuesday, Nov. 2 at 9 AM for a Divine Liturgy and Panakhyda to be celebrated for all deceased members.
- 4. Many thanks to Father Brian Kolodiejchuk, MC who gave such a thought-provoking speech-and-video presentation last Friday night, after the concelebration of Divine Liturgy by three priests (thanking you, too, Father Walter Dudych!). After this wonderful evening, Saint Mother Theresa of Calcutta has surely become even more present in the lives of all who attended. May God bless Father Kolodiejchuk for spending this time with us, and we as a parish ask him and his congregation to continue to keep us in their prayers.

- 5. Yesterday was the first day of a new ALL-CHURCH FORUM of the Ukrainian Catholic Church. (It is basically our introductory portion of the world-wide Synod on Synodality organized concurrently by the Holy Father Pope Frances. The first online session was yesterday; the next one will be on December 11. It is "supposed to become a platform for an all-Church discussion of issues raised by the Synod of Bishops in order to follow the "synodal path" with the Catholic Church", says the Head of our Church Sviatoslav. Taking part online each time, from each eparchy of our Church, is: the bishop, a priest, a monk, a nun and a layman. Let us pray for the success of these meetings according to God's will.
- 6. Come at noon this Saturday, Nov. 6th, to the Shashkevych monument in the little park named after him, located by St. Andrew's church on Euclid Ave. We will sing a panakhyda on the occasion of his 110th birthday -- the priest-poet famous for speaking out on behalf of justice for Ukrainians.

- 9. Ordination to the Diaconate -- On Friday, November 12 at our Sts. Volodymyr & Olha Cathedral, a new deacon will be ordained for our archeparchy at 10 AM. Subdeacon Anton Sloboda invites you to participate via livestreaming straight from the Cathedral: Sts Volodymyr & Olha Ukrainian Catholic Cathedral -(https://www.youtube.com/c/STVOCA). Please pray for him and for all clergy. Pray, too, for more vocations to the priesthood and religious life.

Our present Covid restrictions: WEDDINGS, BAPTISMS, FUNERALS -- The newest Manitoba restrictions of Oct. 29 still keep the maximum number of people allowed for indoor weddings, baptisms and funerals as 25, in addition to the essential staff and photographer. Our parish is open to all, regardless of the kind of passport they may carry, so, because of government mandate, it is up to the families to choose the 25 people for these functions.

Happily, we do have very good LIVESTREAMING available for all such events.

This does not affect our Sunday or other Divine Liturgies, however: we are still "permitted" to have up to 33% of capacity, as long as we maintain social distancing. And our church is quite big...

BTW... there is generally an opportunity for **Confession** prior to every Divine Liturgy. Let us take advantage of that for our own personal growth in holiness and clarity of how we live our Faith. But also never hesitate to ask your parish priest...
