NEW BLESSED VASYL' TEACHING KIT!



Father John Sianchuk, C.Ss.R., Shrine Director Bohdana Kornelyuk, Shrine Coordinator at Bishop Velychkovsky National Martyr's Shrine announced the trilling news of NEW educational kit based on the life story of Blessed Bishop and Martyr Vasyl Velychkovsky, C.Ss.R. This new kit was created to introduce a Blessed Martyr of 20th century, whose relics are in Winnipeg, Manitoba, to the catechists and students.

Blessed Vasyl Velychkovsky, C.Ss.R. is a martyr of Catholic Church beatified in 2001 by Saint John Paul II. Blessed Vasyl lived in the time of the Soviet persecution of the Catholic Church. Blessed Vasyl spent his last year of life in Winnipeg. In 1973, Blessed Vasyl passed away due to severe physical and mental tortures he had undergone in Soviet **prisons**. Now his holy relics – a fully intact body – are in the Shrine at St. Joseph's Ukrainian Catholic Church, 250 Jefferson Avenue, HERE in Winnipeg. This is the only Shrine in North America that has a full body relic of a martyr – a true treasure for the Catholic Church. Also, there is a museum dedicated to Blessed Vasyl, where pilgrims can learn his life story and see different interesting artifacts from his life.

The Blessed Martyr Vasyl Velychkovsky C.Ss.R Kit consists of a *Life Story* of Blessed Martyr Bishop Vasyl Velychkovsky, a teachers` manual, a Workbook for students, a Timeline, 28 fact cards and a memory stick with electronic



Priest and Martyr Blessed Roman Lysko

Father Roman Lysko died at the age of 35 in a Communist jail in soviet Ukraine on October 14, 1949. The "official" reason for death was recorded as heart failure, but those who were in prison with him know better that this healthy young priest died from the torture and abuse that he received.

He was ordained in 1941 and ended up serving as a priest for some eight years before his martyrdom. And most of it was in a wartime situation plus Fascist and Communist atrocities. He was appointed to various pastoral posts in almost hopeless situations. He served as best he could. When churches were destroyed or locked down, he gathered children and youth into houses for catechism and singing. He was arrested on the 8th of September 1949. There were accounts that the young Father Roman Lysko was singing psalms to the Lord in prison with his full voice. For this he was declared mad. Thus, his sister Volodymyra spent years visiting psychiatric hospitals looking for him, hoping to find him, but did not (as he was already dead). And there was also an account that he was sealed into a wall while still alive and left there to die. One of his former cellmates would simply confirm that one day they were all taken out of the cell, leaving only Father Lysko there. The next day they when they returned to that cell he was no longer there.

What is certain is that this young energetic priest who loved to serve the Lord and loved the people of the Lord was imprisoned and maltreated and died in prison simply because he was a Catholic priest and

would not deny his faith and would not break his commitment to the Lord and His Church. He is one the of 27 martyrs recognized and declared blessed by Pope Saint John Paul II in Ukraine on June 27, 2001
